

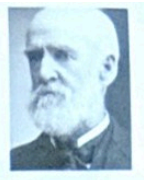
Susanne Small's History



Commissioned by Illinois State Legislature to paint a portrait of Governor Richard Yates in 1907 (painting now hangs in the State Capital Building)



Dr. Abram Small (father) passed away October 7, 1914



She & Mabel helped to establish the local chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and she was elected Regent in 1922

Lennington (brother) was sworn in as Governor of Illinois in 1921 & again in 1925

Passed away November 13, 1933

Studied painting in Paris & Spain under impressionist influences of Monet from 1908 to 1909

Had a studio on Court Street in 1890

Enrolled at the Art Institute of Chicago 1906-1907 & lived about 4 1/2 miles from the school

Taught at Central School in 1880

Graduated from Kankakee High School in 1875

Born April 27, 1856

Paris 1860: Parisian markets overflowed with Pigment Merchants

First Impressionist Exhibit is held in Paris in 1874
